# ARTILLERY CLERKS' ASSOCIATION CHARTER

#### General

- 1. The Association, entitled the "Artillery Clerks' Association," was formed at Woolwich on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> March 1998. This Charter is being adopted to guide its activities. The Charter may be changed at any time by the Committee to reflect the wishes of the Association members.
- 2. The Aim and Object of the Artillery Clerks' Association is to promote comradeship amongst its members, both serving and retired and to provide a focal point for all members of the Association. The Association is essentially an old comrades' association of former Artillery Clerks, either serving or retired.
- 3. The Artillery Clerks' Association is affiliated to and is a Branch of the Royal Artillery Association (RAA). All members of the Royal Artillery Association will be granted life membership of the RAA on acceptance.

#### Eligibility

- 4. <u>Full Members</u>. Full membership of the Association is open to any former Artillery Clerk in the rank range Sergeant to Warrant Officer Class 1, either serving or retired. Membership may also be granted, with the recommendation of a former Artillery Clerk, to clerks who served in the Royal Artillery in the rank range from Gunner to Bombardier, and have subsequently been promoted to Sergeant in the Adjutant General's Corps.
- 5. <u>Honorary Members</u>. Honorary Membership of the Association is specially designed to cover the widows and relatives of deceased Artillery Clerks. Other special cases for honorary membership will be considered on merit by the Committee and voted upon by the Committee and voted upon by the members at the Annual General Meeting (AGM). Honorary members may not vote on matters voted upon at the AGM.
- <u>Authorization</u>. Membership of the Association may be sought by anyone under these rules. In the event of there being some doubt regarding application, the Artillery Clerks' Association Committee will arbitrate. The Association Committee has the right to refuse any application for membership, or cancel any existing membership, for example, for disciplinary reasons.

#### Purpose

- 7. The specific purpose of the Association is to provide:
  - a. A focal point for comradeship, largely through periodic reunions of:
    - (1) A formal Annual Reunion Dinner
    - (2) An informal Dinner to be held at a frequency and location to be decided by the Committee; to include wives, girlfriends and widows.
    - (3) A very limited welfare service. This essentially means that the Artillery Clerks' Association, in promoting contacts between members, provides a network through which help can be given to any member. The focus for this activity within the Association is the Secretary.

#### Organization

- a. President (Honorary).
- b. Chairman.
- c. Secretary. Responsibilities cover:
  - (1) Association Membership.
  - (2) Correspondence.
  - (3) Providing a focus for the Association's welfare work and links to the RAA.
  - (4) Production of a periodic newsletter.
  - (5) Coordinating the activities of the Area Representatives.
- d. Treasurer. Responsibilities cover:
  - (1) Maintenance of a bank account entitled the "Artillery Clerks' Association".
  - (2) Accounting for all the finances of the Artillery Clerks' Association.
  - (3) Presenting a Statement of the Account to the Committee (as and when required) and annually at the AGM.
- e. Regional Representatives. Responsibilities cover:
  - (1) The recruitment of new members.
  - (2) Maintaining an area membership list.
  - (3) Coordinating travel to Reunions and other Association activities.

Areas covered are:

- (1) Scotland
- (2) Wales
- (3) The North West consisting of Cumbria, Lancashire, Merseyside, Greater Manchester, and Cheshire.

- (4) The North consisting of Northumberland, Tyne & Wear, Durham, Cleveland, Yorkshire and Humberside.
- (5) The Midlands consisting of Derbyshire, Nottinghamshire, Lincolnshire, Shropshire, Staffordshire, West Midlands, Leicestershire, Hereford & Worcestershire, Warwickshire and Northamptonshire.
- (6) The East consisting of Buckinghamshire, Bedfordshire, Hertfordshire, Cambridgeshire, Norfolk, Suffolk and Essex.
- (7) London and The South consisting of Oxfordshire, Berkshire, Hampshire, Isle of Wight, Greater London, Surrey, Sussex and Kent.
- (8) The West consisting of Cornwall, Devon, Somerset, Dorset, Gloucestershire, Avon and Wiltshire.
- (9) Germany.
- (10) The rest of the world covered by the Secretary.
- 9. Additional members of the Committee may be appointed by the Chairman as required, for example, Reunion Secretary and Assistant Secretary.

#### Fees

- 10. Membership fees are to be determined by the Committee. There is to be a fee to join the Association and the annual renewal fee.
- 11. Fees are to cover the costs of administration, including telephone calls, postage and stationery.
- 12. Reunions are to be self financing, that is, those attending are to meet the full cost of all activities of the Reunion.

### THE 64TH ARTILLERY CLERKS' REUNION AND ASSOCIATION INAUGURAL DINNER

The weather was kind as the former Artillery Clerks, both serving and retired, descended upon Woolwich to attend the 64<sup>th</sup> Artillery Clerks' Reunion Dinner on Sat 7 Mar 98. Prior to the Dinner, members assembled in the Eyre's Lounge of the RA Sergeants' Mess, Woolwich to be briefed on the formation of an Artillery Clerks' Association. The decision to form an Association was unanimous. Lt Col Joe Falzon BEM RA kindly volunteered his services as Chairman, WO1 (SSM) Mark Testi AGC (SPS) as Secretary and Capt Paul Corker AGC (SPS), although not present at the Dinner, has since notified his intent to volunteer for the post of Treasurer. The decision was met with a warm response and the Artillery Clerks' Association was declared duly formed by the new Chairman. The Association was formed to promote comradeship amongst its members, both serving and retired and to provide a focal point for all members of the Association.

The Guest of Honour, Maj Gen Mike Shellard CBE, Colonel Commandant RA, representing the Master Gunner St James's Park, and guest WO1 (RASM) Alan Durrant, joined the assembled group in the Ballroom for a Reunion photograph which is shown on the rear page.

After pre drinks, Dinner commenced chaired by WO1 Mel Charlton LSL/RA. After a most excellent meal, with entertainment provided on the piano by two young Greek ladies from the Music Department, Goldsmith College, Newcross, a short break was taken.

Following the loyal toast, the Chairman proceeded with his speech of thanks to the various individuals who had helped to make the Reunion a success. A special welcome was made to the various guests and a special mention about Sgt Merv Chadwick of 22 Regt RA. There was no Reunion Dinner in 1995 as the last of the Artillery Clerks' moved out of Woolwich leaving the Reunion bits and pieces in suspended animation. Sgt Chadwick stepped in and recovered the bits and pieces and built up a database and organised both the 1996 and 1997 Reunion Dinners single-handed. Without the initiative displayed by Sgt Chadwick, the Reunions may have become history. In appreciation of his hard work the Guest of Honour Maj Gen Shellard CBE made a presentation to Sgt Chadwick, from all those in attendance. The Chairman then read out the numerous greetings and apologies from around the world.


